Dear Scott,

We are writing to suggest the criteria for qualifying grocery stores be enhanced. Specifically, there are entire towns and rural economic centers that can support and genuinely need affordable rental housing yet have no grocery store currently on the QAP list. This, in fact, is the issue we face here in Highlands and this factor alone precludes us from realizing affordable workforce housing.

We request that for such areas, where it can be demonstrated that there is no grocery store in the QAP's list for the entire town or area, that the applicant be allowed to submit specific local store(s) for approval, perhaps in advance of the Preliminary Application. In doing so, they must demonstrate criteria such as:

- a full range of produce, meat, dairy, and non-perishable foods is available as well as basic household goods (paper products, detergents, etc)
- that the store is open at least 6 days a week and for a minimum of 10 hours each day
- that the store demonstrate its sustainability by having been in existence for 5 years or more

Most small rural communities probably have a store that meets this criteria, and there are many small rural communities which need affordable housing that cannot compete using the current criteria.
